Content:

With the rise of populist right-wing parties in Europe, the Brexit vote, and the election of Donald Trump, critical voices against migration, globalization and regional integration have gained prominence across the globe. This talk series is designed to address the manifestations, causes, and consequences of the contestation of migration, globalization and regional integration and relate it to the debate about changes in political conflict in 21st century democracies. It especially sets out to provide insights into the micro-foundations of these processes: do citizens relate to new cultural cleavages that go beyond classic left-right party positioning? And what role do social media play for these political conflicts to be expressed?

This series features talks in German and English. BA- and MA-students of political science and related subjects (depending on their study requirements) have the opportunity to enrol for 3 or 6 credit points. Enrolment for 6 credit points is limited.
